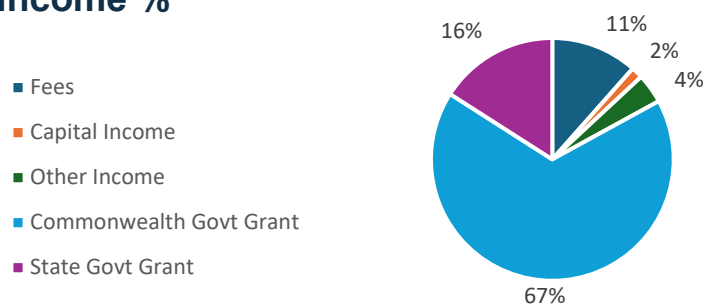

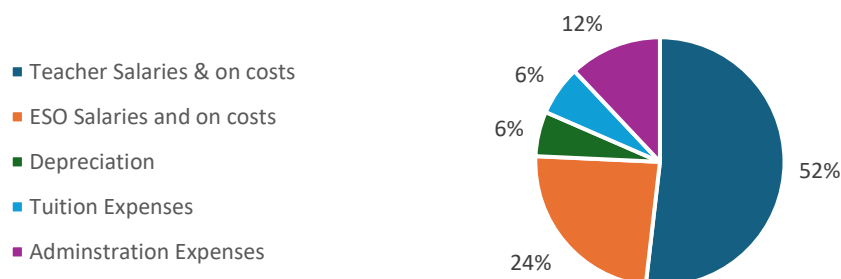
### Income %

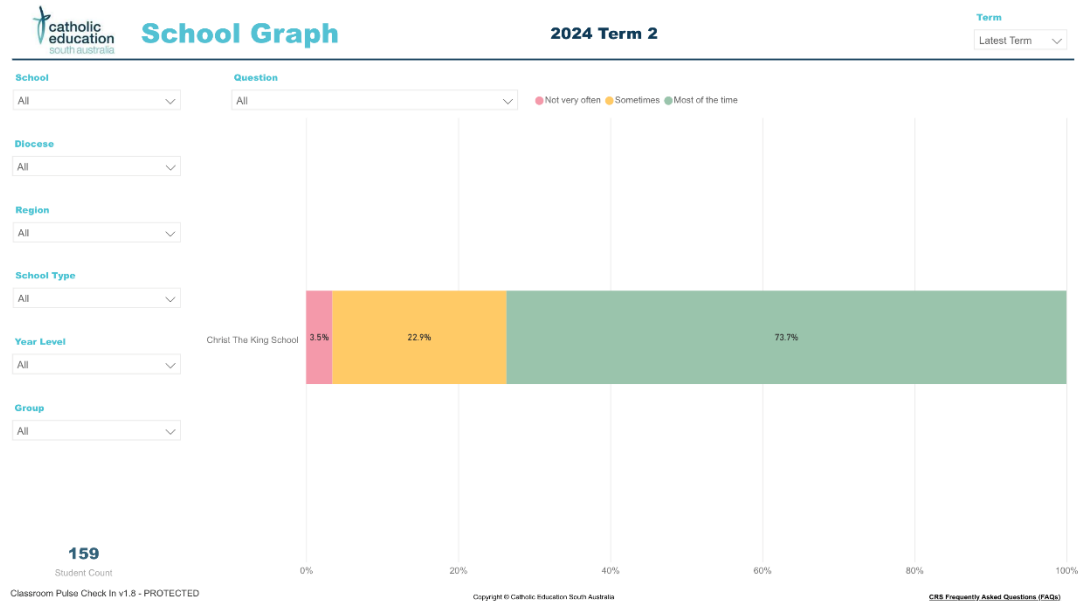

73.7% of students answered 'most of the time' to wellbeing check-in questions asked during the term.



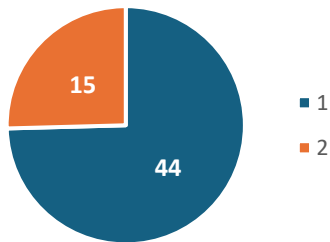


## Parent Satisfaction

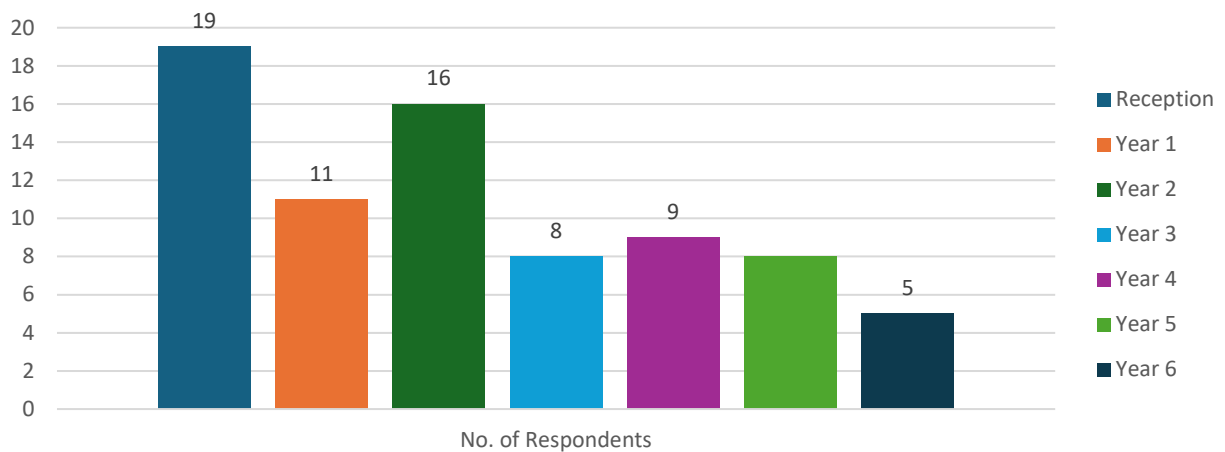
A parent satisfaction survey was conducted in June 2024 to gain understanding of how parents viewed the school and its delivery of education to the school community.

59 respondents participated in the survey. A summary of the results is as follows:

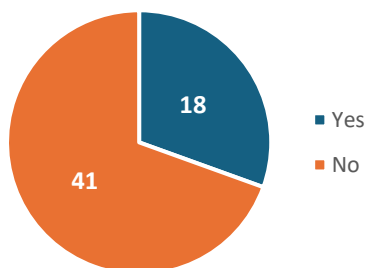
### 1. Number of Children in your family that currently attend Christ the King School



### 2. What year level is/are your child/ren in?

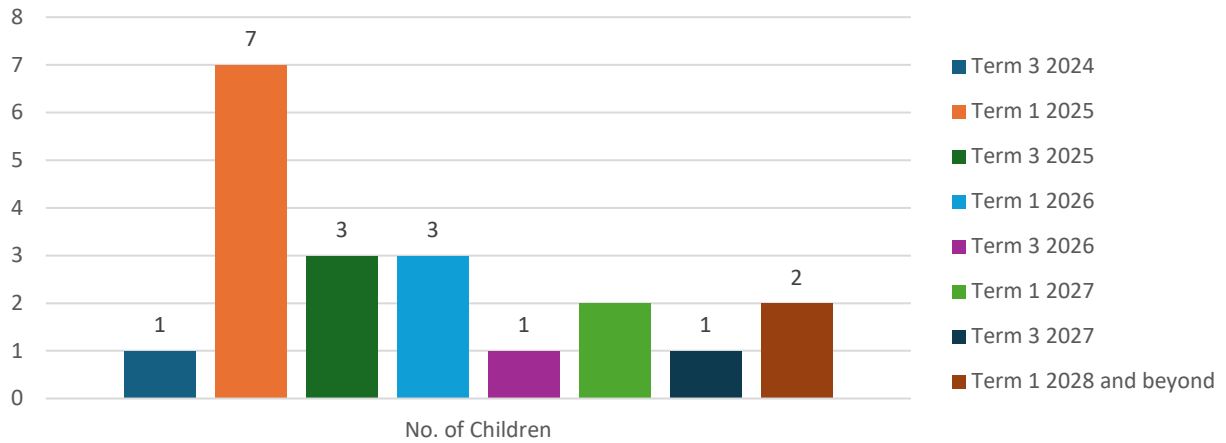


### 3. Do you have any children below 5 years old who are enrolled to start at CTK in the future?





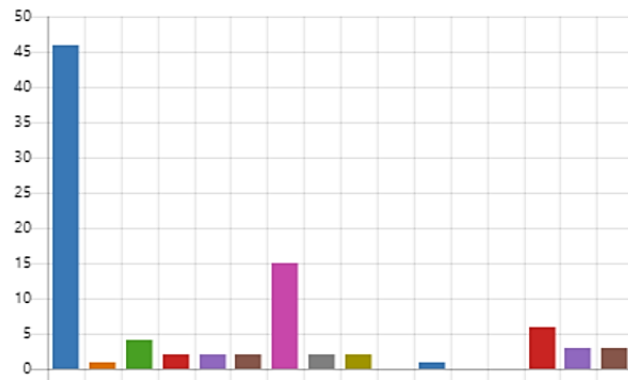
4. If yes, what year will they start Reception (includes Term 1 and Term 3 intake)

The data from these questions shows that Sacred Heart College, Brighton Secondary School and other Catholic secondary schools are the top picks for families when moving to Year 7 after they leave Christ the King School.

A selection of questions which covered five key interest topics were presented as part of the parent survey. The questions provided in the survey asked respondents to rate each question on a scale of 1 to 5 with one being the least and five being most when relating to the question's sentiment. Sentiments included least/most likely, least/most satisfied, not at all well/very well.

Below are the average ratings for each topic:

Overall, parents rated our school to be safe, secure with a very good overall atmosphere and sense of community and belonging. Parents were also asked to select their top choices indicating our schools' strengths and areas for improvement. Multiple options could be selected to answer the question. Below is a summary of the results.

The top greatest strengths of our school as chosen by our school parents are:
