We are approaching the end of Lent and looking forward to the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday. STATIONS OF THE CROSS- Yr 6

Holy Thursday 28th March

Each year it is traditional for our Yr6 students to commemorate Jesus' last day on earth with a production of The Stations of the Cross. The production through tableaux and prayer retells the station from Jesus arrest through to his placement in the tomb. This is a solemn production but one that never fails to move those present. Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme har result.

Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of cle caused Leaia a lot of worry.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Le walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a si supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve the and living conditions.

"We are very thankful and grateful for the water tank. It has helped us so much and made our daily life easier," Leaia said.


