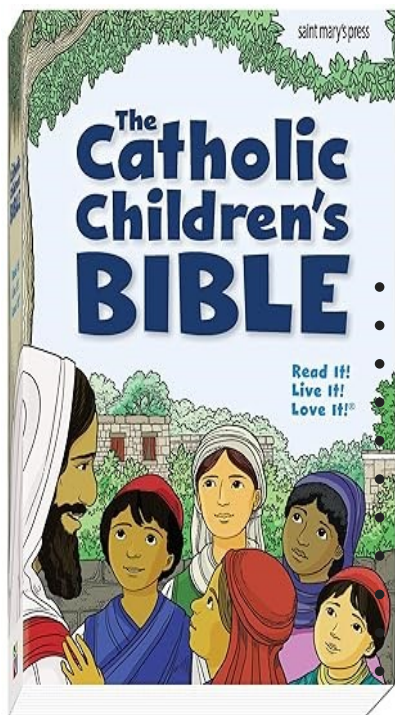

10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators CREATING FAMILY RULES FOR USING DEVICES

A set of family rules agreed on with children can provide the skills, responsible use of devices like tablets, smartphones, gaming consoles and consoles. By developing rules based on technology, it opens the conversation regarding boundaries and expectations, ensuring a healthy balance of screen-time. This guide will help you to develop an age-appropriate family agreement to suit your household.

- 1. WORK TOGETHER**
Establishing rules together shows children that you are taking their views into account. It also shows them that you are taking their views into account. It is important to involve children when you are setting rules. This helps them to understand why the rules are in place and to agree to follow them.
- 2. AGREE TIME LIMITS AND SUITABLE TIMES**
Set realistic limits on screen time. Consider the age of the child and the type of device. For example, a 10-year-old might have a maximum of 1 hour per day, while a 15-year-old might have a maximum of 2 hours per day. Consider the time of day and the location of use. For example, no devices in bedrooms at night.
- 3. ENCOURAGE HONESTY**
