ICAS ASSESSMENTS 2024

This year we introduced optional ICAS assessments for our students in Year 3-6. These are internationally recognised academic competitions that have been sat by over 10 million school students from 16,000 schools across 41 countries since 1981.

The assessments recognise academic performance in a way similar to sports or the arts, with engaging, fun questions designed by psychometricians, education measurement experts and experienced teachers to test students' higher-order thinking skills.

They also provide rich insights into students' strengths and weaknesses, helping teachers to accelerate learning outcomes and unlock student potential.

The ICAS assessments can be offered across many subject areas but this year we chose to offer English and Maths.

We had a number of Year 4 and 5 students take up the opportunity to participate with some excellent results.
